Our DIY blood pressure machine is available for use. This will enable you to attend the practice and take your own blood pressure reading without the need for an appointment.

Cause - a bite from an infected tick. Early symptoms can include feeling unwell or 'flu-like', rash, headache, stiff neck, muscle pain, tender glands and sensitivity to temperature, sound and light levels Bite size – it can appear anywhere on your body. The bull's-eye has a central red spot, surrounded by a clear circle with a wide red circle on the outside.

Treatment is with antibiotics and is most effective if started as early as possible.

Preventative measures – wear long trousers tucked into socks in long grass and heather or where sheep and deer are. Check skin for ticks after your walk. Tick removers can be purchased from pet/outdoor shops.
